The Love of Hate

Perspectives on anti-Asian aggression

Harassment and violence against Asians in the US is neither recent nor an aberration caused by the previous administration. Some familiarization might be in order:


- Asians are rendered 'invisible' because the history of Asians in America doesn't fit
 a simple racialized narrative. This <u>op-ed by Michael Eric Dyson</u> is an example of
 someone grappling with that complexity from a non-Asian viewpoint.
- In an <u>interview in The New Yorker</u> Renee Tajima-Peña, the director of the documentary "Who Killed Vincent Chin", touches on decades of racialized and sexualized myth-education about what Asians represent to America.
- Chinese were the first foreign nationals to be banned by the US, but not the last.
 Asians have been 'perpetual foreigners' in the US for over 150 years. The PBS series 'Asian Americans' details fights for rights by Asians in America, and how Asian stereotypes have historically resulted in inattention at best.
- Popular notice of anti-Asian crimes and coalition-building by Asian Americans seems to ebb and flow like a tide across decades. This <u>interview with poet Cathy</u>
 Park Hong is like searching the sea with a contemplative gaze.

Regardless, there are ways to act when people are being attacked:

- Aid the harassed. Sign up for bystander intervention sessions with iHollaback.
- Report crimes of hate or aggression. The New York State Attorney General has a special hotline for Coronavirus-hate crimes. Particularly if you are an Asian American, document the incident at Stop AAPI Hate.
