Time to Talk About... | Support & Advocacy committee

Representatives met with the Superintendent, Assistant Director of Special Education, and Director of School Counseling from the Hastings on Hudson School District in a conversation on November 4, regarding a series of conversations to be held with middle and high school students.

This series is called "Time to Talk About Social Justice and Racism". The objective is to create a safe and judgment-free environment for students to ponder and discuss what they were seeing and hearing on the news and their own experiences in school and in the community.

Tête-a-tête with HHS affinity group | Education committee

Participants met with eight students of the Hastings High School Affinity Minority Group on November 11, for a socially-distanced mask-wearing outdoor relaxation lunch time. It was a time of relaxation enjoying student centered conversations.

Our second "Let's Chat" tabling event on November 21 was a great success. An estimated 35-50 people stopped to inquire, with many taking brochures and donating. Exposure to the wider public is important for outreach and testing messaging.

Participants attending the table found passers-by receptive to the free first-aid kits. There was interest in the colorful facemasks and furry caps. Vikki-Lynne Allen was moved when a Caucasian child insisted on buying a Doll of Color.

The donation box worked well once seeded with a few dollars. An area needing further study is how to gather useful data about numbers and manner of interest such that it doesn't disrupt the natural flow.


